## Re: SB 663 (Archuleta/Skinner) - SUPPORT

Dear Chair Bradford,

On behalf of the undersigned organizations, we are pleased to support **SB 663**, which seeks to establish a renewable hydrogen definition and Renewable Portfolio Standard (RPS) eligibility. This coalition shares the common goal of furthering policies and practices to advance the production and use of renewable hydrogen at scale in all sectors to accelerate the transition to a carbon free energy system.

Renewable hydrogen is a key resource for meeting the California's ambitious climate goals. It can be used as a fuel for electricity generation and transportation, as well as energy intensive, hard-todecarbonize industrial sectors such as agriculture, steel manufacturing and cement production, and even aviation. Use of renewable hydrogen for clean firm dispatchable power generation is key to achieving a fully 100% renewable power sector and totally eliminating our use of natural gas.

To address this issue, SB 663 proposes expanding the RPS to include additional renewable hydrogen technologies. Expanding the RPS eligibility to include additional hydrogen-to-electricity conversion technologies can further support the scaling of renewable hydrogen production, diversify the state's fuel/renewable energy mix, expand the use of renewable hydrogen as a long-duration energy storage solution via ongoing procurement processes at the CPUC, and promote a more affordable and resilient grid.

For renewable energy sources, the production process for renewable hydrogen must either use electricity that meets the requirements of the state's RPS program or otherwise employ renewable energy sources such as biomass, solar thermal, photovoltaic, wind, geothermal, fuel cells using renewable hydrogen, linear generators using renewable hydrogen, gas turbines using renewable hydrogen, small hydroelectric generation of 30 megawatts or less, digester gas, municipal solid waste conversion, diverted organic waste, landfill gas, ocean wave, ocean thermal, or tidal current.

Expanding RPS eligibility in this way is strategically important to helping California establish a robust market for renewable hydrogen, as power sector use of renewable hydrogen is not only needed as long duration storage solution, but it is also one of the few scalable near term applications that can help drive down renewable hydrogen costs which will in turn accelerate renewable hydrogen adoption in adjacent, high polluting sectors such as goods movement, maritime shipping and aviation. In short, power sector use of renewable hydrogen is one of the few near-term applications that can scale demand for renewable hydrogen – key to establishing a scaled, low-cost renewable hydrogen economy and to achieving economy wide decarbonization.

For these reasons, we strongly support SB 663 and believe this measure is critical towards meeting California's ambitious climate goals and support a robust California market.
